Mt Albert War Memorial Reserve site, Wairere Avenue, Mt Albert

We're building the Central Interceptor, a super-sized wastewater tunnel to reduce overflows, creating a better environment for you to enjoy.

Site update

Work has been moving steadily and all excavations on site are now completed and the permanent infrastructure has been installed. We have now begun reinstating the site as we move into the final stages of the project.

Key construction facts:

- The main shaft is 30 metres deep
- MH01 was 9.5 metres deep
- MH02 is 3 metres deep
- MH03 at 10 metres deep
- MH17 at 4.8 metres deep
- We have also installed 79 metres of new pipelines to connect these manholes and chambers to the shaft.

MH17 acts as the bifurcation chamber (which separates wastewater flows), has had all permanent works completed and tested. The existing sewer line is now flowing through this chamber and once the main shaft and Central Interceptor connection are finished, flows will be able to be diverted as required.

The plant room structure itself is complete and is currently being painted. The installation of the permanent power to the plant room is almost complete. All the fibre cabling that was laid along Wairere Ave will be connected to the plant room by the end of the year.

We have now removed all temporary works from the site and reinstatement is underway. In addition, we have been working closely with the Auckland Council on the design of the replacement pedestrian ramp to the upper car park. This work also includes the installation of new lighting to improve safety and visibility in the area.

Over the coming weeks, our focus will remain on reinstatement, final tidy-up works and continuing to progress the pedestrian ramp and lighting upgrades with Council. The last thing to be done will be the asphalting and line marking of the carpark, so we can hand the whole area back to the reserve for parking once again.

Mt Albert, by the numbers:

- Water use 4,460 KL
- Electricity use 277,477 kWh
- Fun fact: during the 2024 season, our team kept the work going drinking their share of 2,288 kg of coffee beans and 950 kg of hot chocolate purchased across the project!
