CENTRAL BULLETIN

Walmsley Park site, 727-761 Sandringham Rd Extension, Mt Roskill

We're building the Central Interceptor, a super-sized wastewater tunnel to reduce overflows, creating a better environment for you to enjoy.

Project highlights:

We completed drilling the 63m deep shaft at our Walmsley Park site. This site is one of only three drilled shafts on the project. We installed glass-reinforced liners into the shaft.

The team constructed a diversion chamber around the existing sewer in the park. Here, wastewater can be collected during wet weather events and diverted into the shaft and them on into the Central Interceptor tunnel below. The new manhole that was constructed has already been connected to the shaft for flow diversion works planned for mid-2026.

We have built a 5 x 6m plant room in the corner of our site. This structure is the control point for the chamber gate and houses associated electrical and mechanical equipment for regulating flows across the new infrastructure. It is the permanent blue structure you will see in place at the end of the project.

We have put the pedestrian crossing back and reinstated the park. As part of the restoration, we have planted 24 trees, replanted the grassed areas and replaced the footpaths.

Achievements

- 63m deep shaft excavated
- 1785.2 kL of potable water used (January 2021-May 2025)
- 958.3 m³ of concrete poured (January 2021-May 2025)
- 74844 kWh of electricity used (Sep 2021-June 2025)
- In 2024 we used 2288 kg of coffee beans, and 950 kg of hot chocolate


